A Welcome from the Vicar

On Easter morning, we read that the risen Christ appeared to two terrified women, he comes to Mary who thinks he's the gardener and calls her by name, he walks to Emmaus with two troubled disciples and then disappears. Later, he comes to the disciples gathered in a locked upper for fear of their lives. Together, these are small signs of life and light and hope and joy to a few, still reeling from the horror of seeing their Lord crucified.

The message of Easter is just that one of light in the darkness, hope in despair, joy and peace in anguish and pain. It doesn't deny the crucifixion in all its awfulness, but it transforms it as people encounter the light and life of the risen Christ in their daily lives and are changed by it, little by little.

Easter reminds us that nothing of faith makes sense unless Jesus is at the centre of everything we do and are. We are drawn into a deeper friendship with him. Invited into his life, death, and resurrection, we are commissioned to be a sign of his resurrection to our world.

Let us resolve, therefore, to go out into the world and proclaim the news that the "Lord is Risen Indeed".


WHAT USE ARE WORDS? G.K. CHESTERTON

The tale has been retold with patronising pathos by elegant skeptics and with fluent enthusiasm by boisterous best-sellers. But, the grinding power of the plain words of the Gospel story is like the power of mill stones; and those who can read them simply enough will feel as if rocks had been rolled upon them.

Of what use are words about such words as these? What is the use of word-painting about the dark garden filled suddenly with torchlight and furious faces? "Are you come out with swords and staves as against a robber? All day I sat in your temple teaching, and you took me not." Can anything be added to that massive and gathered restraint of that irony? "Daughters of Jerusalem, weep not for me but weep for yourselves and your children." As the High Pries asked what further need he had of witnesses, we might well ask what further need we have of words.

All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the Lord hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.
